Procession and Seating of the Metropolitan and Bishops

All please stand as the procession enters.

Welcoming the Metropolitan-Elect

All stand and face the back of the church as the Metropolitan-Elect is welcomed.

The Prolocutor, the Executive Officers and the Provincial Chancellor greet the Metropolitan-Elect. The Prolocutor welcomes the Metropolitan-Elect.

Prolocutor: Your grace, we welcome you in the name of Christ to be our Metropolitan and Archbishop. We have come to celebrate the new ministry which has been entrusted to you by our church. All things are now ready so that you may receive the symbols of your sacred office and be installed as the next Metropolitan of the Ecclesiastical Province of Ontario. May the Lord be in your heart and in your mind as you hear God's holy word and proclaim the glad news of the Gospel.

All: The Lord be with you in all things.

Met-Elect: The Lord is my strength, my hope, and my salvation.

Procession of the Metropolitan-Elect

Gloria

The Metropolitan-Elect's welcoming party is led to their seats during the Gloria.

The Collect

Almighty God, You have built your Church on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief cornerstone. Join us together in unity of spirit by their teaching, that we may become a holy temple, acceptable to you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

1 Samuel 3: 1-10

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread. At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. Then the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' and he said, 'Here I am!' and ran to Eli, and said, 'Here I am, for you called me.' But he said, 'I did not call; lie down again.' So he went and lay down. The Lord called again, 'Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, 'Here I am, for you called me.' But he said, 'I did not call, my son; lie down again.' Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, 'Here I am, for you called me.' Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. Therefore Eli said to Samuel, 'Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." ' So Samuel went and lay down in his place. Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, 'Samuel! Samuel!' And Samuel said, 'Speak, for your servant is listening.'

Reader: Hear what the spirit is saying to the church.

All: Thanks be to God

Psalm 139: 1-6, 13-17

*Lord, you have searched me out and known me; * you know my sitting down and my rising up; you discern my thoughts from afar. You trace my journeys and my resting-places * and are acquainted with all my ways. Indeed, there is not a word on my lips, * but you, O Lord, know it altogether. You press upon me behind and before * and lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; * it is so high that I cannot attain to it. Where can I go*

*then from your Spirit? * where can I flee from your presence? I will thank you because I am marvelously made; * your works are wonderful, and I know it well. My body was not hidden from you, * while I was being made in secret and woven in the depths of the earth. Your eyes beheld my limbs, yet unfinished in the womb; all of them were written in your book; * they were fashioned day by day, when as yet there was none of them. How deep I find your thoughts, O God! * how great is the sum of them! If I were to count them, they would be more in number than the sand; * to count them all, my life span would need to be like yours.*

The Gospel

Matthew 5: 1-16

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Saint Matthew.

All: *Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.*

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying: 'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. 'Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. 'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. 'Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. 'Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. 'Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you. 'You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled underfoot. 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

Installation of the Prolocutor and the Metropolitan

The congregation is seated.

The Prolocutor-Elect stands before the Provincial Chancellor.

Chancellor: Laura, God has called you to be the Prolocutor of the Provincial Synod of the Church in this Province, and I certify that you have been duly and lawfully elected by your fellow members of the Provincial Synod meeting in solemn council. I now require of you the Oath of this Office: *Will you perform the duties of Prolocutor of the Provincial Synod of the Ecclesiastical Province of Ontario to the best of your ability and in accordance with the Constitution and Canons of this Province?*

Pro-Elect: I will, with God's help.

Chancellor: In accordance with the Constitution of this Synod, I install you, Laura, as our Prolocutor.

The Metropolitan-Elect stands before the Provincial Chancellor and new Prolocutor.

Chancellor: Archbishop Anne, you have been called by God to be the Chief Pastor of the Church in this Province, and I certify that you have been duly and lawfully elected by your fellow members of the Provincial Synod meeting in solemn council. I now require of you the Oath of this Office: *Will you, as our Metropolitan, conform your life to that of Jesus, who came not to be ministered to, but to minister?*

Met-Elect: I will, with God's help.

Prolocutor: You are now responsible for giving leadership as the Chief Pastor of the Church in Ontario. Will you speak God's Word to the Church and the World, and take council with your fellow Bishops?

Met-Elect: I will, with God's help.

Prolocutor: Will you preside with care over the meetings of the Provincial Synod and the work which it undertakes, and will you visit every diocese of our Province? Will you seek the advice of the laity and the clergy, and will you faithfully minister among us by preaching the Word and celebrating the Eucharist?

Met-Elect: I will do this, with God's help.

Prolocutor: Will you earnestly seek the unity of the one Church, and work for justice and dignity for everyone?

Met-Elect: I will, with God's help.

The Prolocutor then addresses the People:

Prolocutor: Will you who witness this new beginning, support and uphold Anne our Metropolitan in this ministry?

All: We will.

The Metropolitan-Elect prays silently.

The Provincial Chancellor then holds before the Metropolitan-Elect the words of the Oath, the words resting upon a Bible open to the place in St. Mark's Gospel, 10:43 - 45, where it is written:

But it is not to be so among you; whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

Met-Elect: Having been chosen by God and duly elected, and now to be installed, I solemnly swear that I will carry out the duties, responsibilities and customs of the Office of Metropolitan to the best of my ability and power, and in accordance with the law of the Church and of God.

The out-going Metropolitan steps forward and hands the Metropolitan's Cross to the Provincial Chancellor. The out-going and in-coming Metropolitans then greet each other.

The Chancellor presents the Metropolitan-Elect with the Metropolitan's Cross.

Chancellor: I, Jean, Chancellor of the Province, on behalf of the Provincial Synod of the Ecclesiastical Province of Ontario, do install you, Anne, as Metropolitan. May our Lord Jesus Christ preserve your going out and your coming in from this time forth for ever more. **Amen.**

Leader: Sisters and brothers in Christ, we are called to proclaim the story of God's love and mercy and, above all, the Gospel of our Saviour Christ: Let us pray for Archbishop Anne, who has come among us to preach the word of God and to lead us in faith.

Leader: Let us pray for the committees and organizations of the Ontario Provincial Synod, and for Anne our Metropolitan and Laura our Prolocutor, that with wisdom, humility and good humour, we will stay close to the heart of Jesus, and steadfastly build up the Church he loves.

All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us pray for all the people and clergy in this Ecclesiastical Province of Ontario, that we will always encourage, strengthen and support one another in all our ministries.

Leader: Lord, in your mercy,
All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us pray for ourselves, that together we may learn the ways of the kingdom, patterned in worship and practiced in love. Following the example of Jesus, may we always welcome and embrace those who are isolated or marginalized, and stand with those who are exploited, impoverished or persecuted.

Leader: Lord, in your mercy,
All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: Almighty and everliving God, source of all wisdom and understanding, be present with all who take counsel for the renewal and mission of your Church. Teach us in all things to seek first your honor and glory. Guide us to perceive what is right, and grant us all the courage to pursue it and the grace to accomplish it; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
All: Amen.
