THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

Wisdom 3:1-9

The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them. The Great Thanksgiving

All glory and honour are yours, Father and Son, with the Holy Spirit in the holy Church, now and for ever. **Amen.**
