And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and, when he had given thanks, he brake it; and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all, of this; for this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we thy humble servants, with all thy holy Church, remembering the precious death of thy beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, do make before thee, in this sacrament of the holy Bread of eternal life and Cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he hath commanded;

And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion;

And we pray that by the power of thy Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy Communion may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. **Amen.**

### SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI

October 4th is the Feast Day of Saint Francis of Assisi, the Patron Saint of animals. Francis preached to people and animals, saying that it is the natural duty of all living things to give praise to the Creator – and that it is the particular duty of human beings to cherish and protect nature, as stewards of creation and because we, too, are creatures.

An old legend says that as Francis lay dying, he looked upon his donkey and thanked him for carrying him and accompanying him for so many miles. And so, we honour the place of animals in the grand sweep of God's creation, acknowledge them as fellow creatures of God, and express our thanks for the service, comfort and companionship they provide to us. There are many images and symbols of animals in the windows, walls, carvings and hangings in the Cathedral – make sure to look for them!

May the abundant blessing of God who made and holds every living thing in the pulse of God's creative power be upon you today and always.
